#### Pupil Premium Funding Report for St John's C of E School

The government introduced new funding arrangements for schools in 2011. One of the key changes was the introduction of the Pupil Premium Grant, which is linked to the number of pupils receiving free school meals (FSM). Details of the amount our school received and its allocation can be seen below:

#### Pupil Premium Allocation for 2015/16

Per pupil 2015/16	£1,320
Total allocation for St John's	£7,920

#### Report on expenditure 2015/16

The majority of the Pupil Premium Funding is spent on increased provision of staff support in class. Funds have been allocated mainly to the staffing budget and used towards providing one to one support and tuition for identified children to support at least expected progress. In addition, St John's adopts other strategies and activities to raise the attainment and progress according to individual need. For children eligible for free school meals, support may include the provision of:

- Additional support inside the classroom
- Additional support outside the classroom
- Personalised learning resources
- Support for extra-curricular activities
- Support for residential trips

St John's has approximately 6% of pupils on Pupil Premium funding. The majority of these pupils are making good progress and reaching national standards of attainment and progress in most core subjects.

Due to small numbers at our school, data showing achievement and progress of Pupil Premium Grant pupils is not published on our website but monitored regularly by Head, SLT and school governors.

#### Pupils Premium Allocation for 2016/17 for St John's C of E

Our allocation for 2016/17 is £6,600 and will be focused similarly to the current expenditure model.
